



Sports Premium Review 2015-2016

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. The funding is spread over 3 years from 2013 to 2016. Schools receive £8,000 plus £5 for each child on roll from Y1 to Y6.

During the past year the Sports Premium funding has allowed pupils to access local competitions and festivals through our partnership with a local sport provider called Active Fusion.

Activities included:

Competitions with schools from across the locality

We have also provided a wider range of opportunities for children to take part in extracurricular sport provided by trained coaches through partnership with Active Fusion

This led to an increase in the number of pupils taking part in additional sporting activities. These clubs run after school.

Impact of Sports Premium Spending 2015-16

Our partnership with Active Fusion enabled the school to participate in a wide variety of inter-school competitions which enriched the curriculum and increased children's enjoyment of sport whilst improving skill development. However, when evaluating the package Active Fusion offered, it was felt that due to their high turnover of staff our teachers and children didn't have the consistency that we required. As a result of this we decided to not to renew the contract with Active Fusion for the coming Academic Year. We have, however, developed a partnership with Activ8 Coaching, a local coaching company keen to promote high quality sport within schools we are also benefitting from the support offered by REACH4 and their Regional Sports Development Officer.

As part of continuing professional development, teachers can work alongside Activ8 Coaches where they feel less confident, we also hope to strengthen links with other schools from within the Reach Family and take advantage of CPD courses offered by Reach4.

A wide range of after school clubs were provided and proved popular with children and parents. This included:

- **Wednesday morning Wake and Shake.** This was available for all children during Breakfast Club and was extremely well attended with up to 30 children participating.
- KS2 After School Club was also well attended with on average 18 children participating in a variety of activities to build a range of skills. The club changed each term with gymnastics being the most popular.
